The Frank Ford Commission

Frank Fords Legacy Inspiring Future Artists

Frank Ford AM, was a pivotal figure in South Australian Arts.

He was the godfather of cabaret, having founded Adelaide Cabaret Festival in May 2001. In 2015, Frank was honoured with an Adelaide Cabaret Festival icon award and remained a member of Adelaide Cabaret Festival's Advocacy Committee until he sadly passed away in 2018.

Frank's dedication and passion were whole-hearted and unwavering. He was a champion of artists, a mentor to several generations of Adelaide artists and creatives, and an active writer and director.

To ensure his passion for supporting new work by local artists continued, Frank bequeathed a generous legacy to the Adelaide Festival Centre Foundation to establish the Frank Ford Commissioning Award.

Working closely with Frank's partner, Sam Harvey, the Frank Ford Commissioning Award was established in 2019 and provides \$20,000 a year toward the commissioning of new South Australian cabaret works to be performed by local artists at Adelaide Cabaret Festival.

About the Show

Skinny is ultimately my personal story but I suspect that many people will relate. I started writing a show about all the things I had done to be skinny from my hospital bed in 2021. I'd just undergone a third traumatic surgery due to complications with a procedure I had performed in my early twenties (ten years earlier) to essentially be skinnier. It was from the hospital bed that I started pondering how things could've been different and how I'd ultimately been trying to conform to someone and something I wasn't for a very long time. This was the beginning of a huge shift for me.

The world we live in today has an unhealthy obsession with people's looks and their weight. We celebrate people for their waist size or how much weight they've lost instead of celebrating their incredible achievements and it's absurd. We use size to describe people rather than other individual features. There's also a massive industry making profits from the insecurities of others. We're talking about thousands of diet brands, shapewear, health and fitness influencers, pharmaceuticals, surgery, cosmetic procedures and more. Research tells us that diets (especially crash diets that don't produce behavioural change) lead to increased and unhealthy weight gain and poor health outcomes. We weren't born hating on our own and each other's bodies and it's something we are taught. But when will it stop?

Through writing this piece I feel like I have so much information from so many different perspectives that I could produce several different versions of this show but ultimately this is my personal story and me calling time on the societal chokehold that has led me here. It's also about healing and it's very much about acceptance in all forms.

I'm so incredibly excited and grateful to be a part of this year's Adelaide Cabaret Festival as the recipient of the Frank Ford Commission and have the opportunity to share this story and hopefully be a small part of some change in this area.
